The AGC Georgia Skills Challenge series was a big hit in 2021 with over 1,900 student competitors and student observers from over 80 schools attending. The series returned to Augusta, Cedartown, Gainesville, Macon and Moultrie with Marietta and Statesboro hosting their first Challenges. The core competitions for the Challenges are Carpentry, Electrical, Masonry, Plumbing, and Welding with Blueprint Reading, Roofing, Fine Furniture/ Woodworking, HVAC, and other disciplines being offered at select Challenges.

"We normally have the whole office working on it, but she took it and ran it this year," JCI Marketing Director Ashby Autry said. "Her passion for Skills Challenges has been instrumental in pulling this year's challenge together."



Industry Staple Fred Hill Passes Knowledge to Next Generation

Ogeechee Technical College's Adult Education Program has found a good friend in The Sack Company Human Resource Manager Fred Hill.

Jimmy Napier, a construction teacher at Jordan Vocational High School College and Career Academy in Columbus, brought seven students to the AGC Skills Challenge in Macon.

"We absolutely loved the experience," Napier said. "We had two students competing in Carpentry and Electrical, with five of my students observing. After talking with my students and administration, we decided two of my observers would like to

compete in Moultrie."

The annual events are held late in the fourth quarter to prepare students for the regional SkillsUSA events in January. Winners of the regional events move on to the state SkillsUSA competitions held each March at the Georgia World Congress Center in Atlanta.

AGC Georgia CEO Mike Dunham said testimonies from teachers like Napier are very important to the mission of AGC Georgia.

"Feedback from our participants reveals how important these events have become in helping students get prepared for the SkillsUSA region and state competitions as well as their long term careers," Dunham said. "It is a testament of our dedication to AGC Georgia's mission of continuing to develop a stronger construction industry by providing members access to the resources and tools they need to improve their businesses."

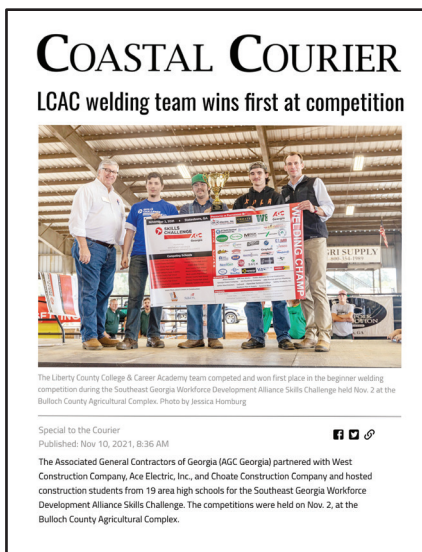
