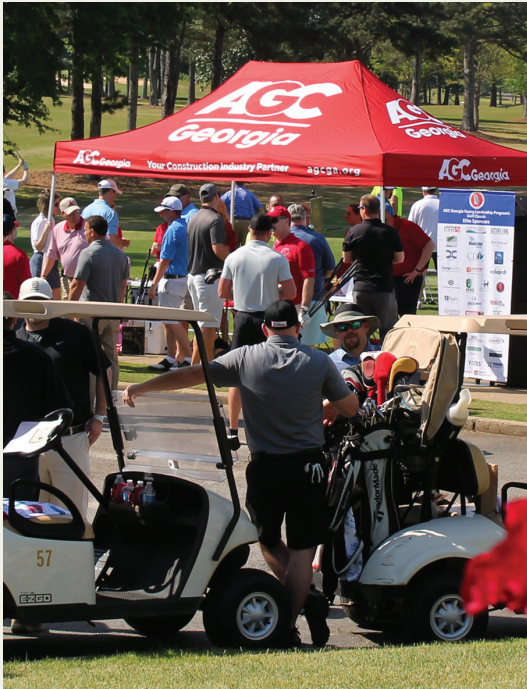

JOINING THE YOUNG LEADERSHIP PROGRAM AT AGC GEORGIA COULD BE ONE OF THE MOST IMPORTANT PROFESSIONAL DECISIONS YOU'LL EVER MAKE.

YLP raises funds to cover travel expenses of Georgia students who earn the right to compete nationally. Skills competitions help increase interest in the construction trades generally, as well as help teach students skills they can use professionally.

YLP participants can't stop talking about how much they benefit from the program, and some even fudge their birthdates to stay in the program "just one more year" after they turn 40.

So what does YLP do?

YLP is all about developing the next generation of strong industry leaders. We start with young professionals who will someday run the companies that make up the AGC membership.

Then the program offers educational opportunities, provides a way to give back to the community, helps you build a vibrant network of peers and develops the specific skills necessary to tackling your next career challenge.

EDUCATION

As a YLP member, you'll enjoy reduced registration at either the Fall Leadership Conference or the Annual Convention.

You'll be eligible to organize, host and attend roundtable forums on timely topics. YLP members select topics and speakers of particular interest to them. You'll also have access to AGC conferences and classes throughout the year.

CHARITABLE PROJECTS

YLP members make a difference in their communities with a variety of charitable projects. In nearly two decades, we have raised and donated almost a million dollars.

Among our initiatives, we have:

- **helped** high school construction students compete at SkillsUSA National
- **provided** toys and clothing to children in the hospital during the holidays
- **offered** scholarships to graduate and undergraduate students
- **packed** care bags with socks, coloring books and reading materials for seriously-ill children at Children's Healthcare of Atlanta and Cancer Treatment Centers of America.
- **renovated** the Georgia Center for Child Advocacy
- **donated** to a program moving women and children from poverty to self-sufficiency

How do we pay for it?

FUNDRAISING

We raise money with an annual Golf Classic and a Sporting Clays Tournament - recently, more than \$95,000 in one year. The AGC Foundation, a tax-exempt 501(c)(3) entity, manages the money for us. Donations are generally tax deductible.

YLP members solicit donations and promote participation in the events. You can volunteer for jobs at the best level of commitment for you - from leading one of the organizing teams to helping out with details during the events.

YLP COUNCIL

The YLP Council governs all of our activities, and the program relies heavily on YLP members volunteering their time, talents and energy to work with Council members to implement YLP activities and the ongoing YLP Action Plan. This plan is designed to ensure the quality growth of the program and an outstanding experience for all YLP participants.

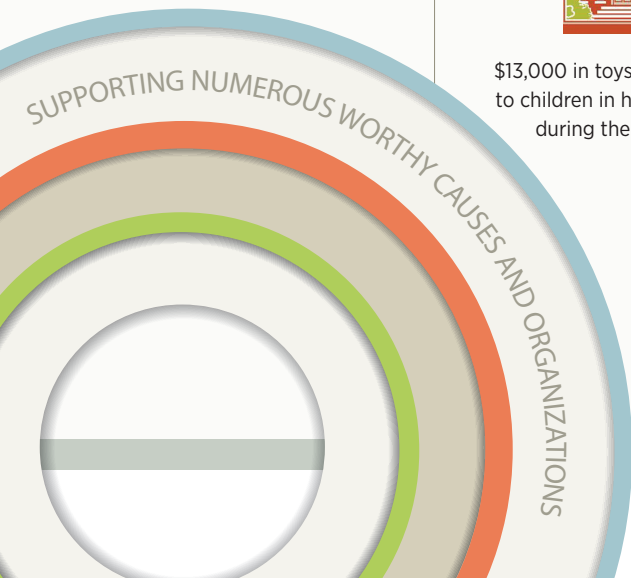

YLP COUNCIL

The YLP Council is composed of YLP members. It directs and manages the program by working closely with AGC Georgia staff to plan and implement yearly activities. Council members are appointed to serve staggered three year terms. The length of the terms provides members with unique leadership experiences, as well as continuity for the program.

Each year a new Chair and Vice Chair are named to lead the Council. The Vice Chair from the previous year moves into the Chair position and a new Vice Chair is selected. Both the YLP Chair and Vice Chair serve on the AGC Georgia Board of Directors and report on YLP activities. The full Board provides guidance and direction to YLP as needed.
