NPDES Level II: Introduction to Design Course and Exam

Tan or Gray Cards

January 4 and 5 ♦ Atlanta

If you are involved in design or review of any land-disturbing activity in Georgia, you will need this course and exam to be in compliance with Georgia EPD.

You will need to meet eligibility requirements as follows:

Design Professionals – Tan Card

- Proof of professional Georgia licensure in the fields of engineering, architecture, landscape architecture, forestry, geology, land surveying or CPESC.

Plan Reviewers - Gray Card

- Have at least 6 months work experience in the field of erosion and sediment control. (Note: In lieu of 6 months of work experience, an individual may obtain Level 1B certification.)

A one-hour, open book exam will be administered at the end of the second day. You must pass with a score of 70% or better.

Why do YOU need lead paint removal training?

Contractors performing renovation, repair and painting projects that disturb lead-based paint in homes, child care facilities, and schools built before 1978 must be certified and must follow specific work practices to prevent lead contamination.

This course was developed by the US EPA, in collaboration with HUD to train renovation, repair, and painting contractors how to work safely in housing with lead-based paint and to comply with EPA's Renovation, Repair, and Painting (RRP) Rule, and HUD's Lead Safe Housing Rule. LEED Green Associate Exam Prep

The Green Associate is now designated a Tier 1 accreditation and is the only credential available in this tier.
