2018 RON AMERSON SUPERVISORS' SAFETY AWARDS NOMINATION



Only employees of AGC Georgia member firms are eligible to be nominated. Deadline for nomination is February 9, 2018.

The Ron Amerson Supervisors' Safety Awards program is designed to recognize members' field supervisors for outstanding contributions to safety on their job sites. The measurement criterion is based on safety incidence rates for individual supervisors in conjunction with actual man-hours directly supervised by each employee. The current call for nominations is for supervisory excellence during calendar year **2017**. Please nominate your firm's supervisors employed by an AGC Georgia general contractor or specialty contractor firm who showed a commitment to outstanding safety during 2017. Awards will be given to supervisors who have not had a lost-time incident.

Man-hours include supervised time for employees on projects including time for subcontractors or temporary labor active on the jobsite.

To nominate each supervisor from your 2017 payroll with an outstanding commitment to safety:

Create a spreadsheet (only Excel forms are permitted) with the following headings:

- Field Supervisor's Name (this includes foremen)
- Man Hours supervised in 2017
- Number of Recordable Cases in 2017
- Number of Lost-Time Accidents in 2017
- Supervisor's Years of Experience as a Supervisor*
- Birth year *

*In preparation for AGC Georgia's participation at the March 2018 CEFGA CareerExpo and SkillsUSA State Championships event, we are asking you to help us to collect some data on the **experience level** and **age** of our state's **jobsite supervisors**. Our association is a strategic partner of CEFGA, the Construction Education Foundation of Georgia, which actively promotes the construction industry as a viable career path to today's middle and high school students. CEFGA's efforts combined with the Governor's Office of Workforce Development and Governor Deal's Trade Five initiative, place a spotlight on the fact that many jobsite supervisors are reaching retirement age, and the industry needs to proactively recruit new talent to fill our industry's workforce needs for many years to come. Providing this information is voluntary.

Each person who supervised a crew with no lost-time accidents will receive a Certificate of Excellence by AGC Georgia and honored at their local Members First Meeting beginning spring 2018.
