# **DETERMINING AGC GEORGIA DUES INVESTMENT**

Your firm's annual dues investment is based on its Gross Construction Revenue (GCR). This sum represents the total figure of all the projects from a firm's most recently completed fiscal year.

#### 1. What is the definition of covered work for the purpose of determining my GCR?

Your GCR includes all private and public construction work, whether negotiated or competitively bid, including work done by wholly-owned subsidiaries that are not general contractor members and the percentage of your participation in joint ventures. \*\*\*If not specifically excluded, all work must be included in your GCR figure.

### 2. How do I report my firm's GCR to AGC Georgia?

Review the Dues & Fees Schedule on the next page and determine which category appropriately represents your firm's GCR. Each August, we will ask you to report figures from your most recently completed fiscal year.

#### 3. What is the verification method of reporting my firm's GCR to AGC Georgia?

Audited reports or CPA-generated reports are encouraged but not required. AGC Georgia asks for your GCR form to be signed by President, Chief Executive Officer, Chief Operating Officer, Chief Financial Officer or CPA.

This process is based on the honor system and follows AGC's founding motto of Skill, Integrity and Responsibility

#### 4. Are my firm's dues a business expense?

Dues payments and other fees are deductible as ordinary and necessary business expense under IRS Code Section162. Dues, excluding monies paid to AGC of Georgia Foundation, Inc., are not deductible as charitable contributions.

### 5. Is non-payment a form of terminating my firm's membership in AGC Georgia?

AGC Georgia does not automatically terminate memberships for non-payment.
